

CHAPTER VI—MISCELLANEOUS

Power to make rules.

42. (1) The State Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, make rules for carrying out of the purposes of this Act.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:—

- (a) the manner of making proposal to establish a private university and the fees payable under sub-section (1) of Section 4;
- (b) other particulars to be contained in the project report under sub-section (2) of Section 4;
- (c) the mode of establishment of endowment fund, the manner of its investment, payment of income from it to the sponsoring body, its forfeiture and mode of its return to the sponsoring body under sub-section (3) of Section 11;
- (d) mode of collection of fee from the private university and depositing amount so collected in the consolidated fund under proviso to Section 12;
- (e) other matters to be provided for in the Statutes under sub-section (1) of Section 25;
- (f) mode of authentication of orders and decisions of the Regulatory Commission and the instruments issued by the Regulatory Commission, terms and conditions of services of Chairman and the members, procedure for meeting of the Regulatory Commission, provision of staff to the Regulatory Commission and their service conditions, temporary association of persons with the Regulatory Commission, its budget, annual report, accounts and audit and such other matters as may be required for proper functioning of the Regulatory Commission under sub-section (9) of Section 36;
- (g) other matters which are required to be prescribed by rules under this Act.

(3) All rules made under this Act shall be laid on the table of the Legislative Assembly.

Power to remove difficulties.

43. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the State Government may, by order published in the official Gazette, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, remove the difficulty:

Provided that no such order shall be made after the expiry of a period of two years from the commencement of this Act.

THE MADHYA PRADESH NIJI VISHWAVIDYALAY
(STHAPANA AVAM SANCHALAN) ADHINIYAM, 2007.

[Received the assent of the Governor on the 24th May, 2007; assent first published in the Madhya Pradesh Gazette (Extra-ordinary) dated the 28th May, 2007.]

An Act to provide for establishment and incorporation of self-financed private universities in the State of Madhya Pradesh for imparting higher education, and to regulate their functions and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Madhya Pradesh Legislature in the fifty-eighth year of the Republic of India as follows:—

CHAPTER I—PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Act may be called the Madhya Pradesh Niji Vishwavidyalaya (Sthapana Avam Sanchalan) Adhiniyam, 2007.

Short title, extent and commencement.

(2) It extends to whole of Madhya Pradesh.

(3) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification, appoint.

2. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires,—

Definitions.

- (a) "Academic Council" means the Academic Council of the private university;
- (b) "Below poverty line family" means a family whose income is below the poverty line as specified by the Government from time to time;
- (c) "Board of Management" means the Board of Management of the private university;
- (d) "Chancellor" means the Chancellor of the private university;
- (e) "Chief Finance and Accounts Officer" means the Chief Finance and Accounts Officer of the private university;
- (f) "Department" means a Department of Studies and includes a Centre of Studies of the private university;
- (g) "Employee" means any person appointed by the private university and includes teachers and other staff of the private university;

- (k) "Endowment Fund" means the endowment fund of the private university;
- (l) "Fee" means the collection made by the private university from the students, by whatever name it may be called;
- (m) "Governing body" means the governing body of the private university;
- (n) "Higher Education" means study of curriculum or course for of knowledge beyond 10+2 level;
- (o) "Main Campus" means the main campus of the private university situated in Madhya Pradesh, consisting of minimum five university teaching departments, schools of studies and where the Vice-Chancellor and Registrar resides and also where the main office of the private university is located;
- (oo) "National Council of Assessment and Accreditation" means, the National Council of Assessment and Accreditation, Bangalore, an autonomous institution of the University Grants Commission;
- (p) "Ordinance" means the Ordinances of the private university;
- (q) "Other Backward Classes" means the Other Backward Classes of Citizens as specified by the State Government vide notification No. F. 85-XXV 4-84, dated the 26th December, 1984 as amended from time to time;
- (r) "Private University" means a private university established and incorporated under this Act;
- (s) "Qualification" means a degree or any other qualification awarded by the private university;
- (t) "Registrar" means the Registrar of the private university;
- (u) "Regulations" means the regulations made under the provisions of this Act;
- (v) "Regulatory Body" means a Central or a State regulatory body established by the Central or State Government for laying down norms and conditions for ensuring standards of higher education;
- (w) "Regulatory Commission" means the Regulatory Commission established under Section 36;
- (x) "Regulatory Council" means the All India Council for Technical Education established under the All India Council for Technical Education Act, 1987(52 of 1987), the Bar Council of India constituted under Section 4 of the Advocates Act, 1961 (25 of 1961), the Council of Architects established under the Architects Act, 1972 (20 of 1972), the Medical Council of India constituted under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (2 of 1956), the Paramedical Council of Madhya Pradesh established under the Madhya Pradesh Sah Chikitsa Parishad Adhiniyam, 2000 (No.1 of 2001) or the Pharmacy Council of India constituted under the Pharmacy Act, 1948 (8 of 1948), as the case may be;
- (y) "Schedule" means the Schedule to this Act;
- (z) "Scheduled Castes" means the Scheduled Castes notified under article 341 of the Constitution of India;
- (za) "Scheduled Tribes" means the Scheduled Tribes notified under article 342 of the Constitution of India;
- (zb) "School of Studies" means an institution maintained by a private university as a place of higher learning and research;
- (zc) "Sponsoring Body" in relation to a private university, means—
- (a) a society registered under the Madhya Pradesh Society Registration Adhiniyam, 1973 (No. 44 of 1973);
- (b) any registered public trust;
- (c) a company registered under Section 25 of the Companies Act, 1956 (No. 1 of 1956); and
- (d) any other body registered under any other Act for the time being in force;
- (zd) "Statutes" means the Statutes made under the provisions of this Act;
- (ze) "Student" means a person enrolled in the private university for pursuing a course of study for the award of a degree, diploma, certificate or other academic distinction;

- (2d) "Teacher" means a professor, reader, lecturer or a person known by any other designation who is required to impart education or to guide research or to render guidance to the students for pursuing a course of study of the private university;
- (2e) "University" means a University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act or a State Act and includes any such institution as may be recognised as University by the University Grants Commission;
- (2f) "University Grants Commission" means the University Grants Commission established under the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956);
- (2g) "University Grants Commission Regulations, 2003" means the University Grants Commission (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003 made under the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956);
- (2h) "Vice-Chancellor" means the Vice-Chancellor of the private university;
- (2i) "Visitor" means the Visitor of the private university.

CHAPTER II—ESTABLISHMENT OF PRIVATE UNIVERSITY

3. The following shall be the general objects of the private university:—

Objects of private university.

- (a) to provide instructions, teaching and training in higher education and to make provisions for research, advancement and dissemination of knowledge;
- (b) to create higher levels of intellectual abilities;
- (c) to establish state of the art facilities for education and training;
- (d) to carry out teaching and research and offer continuing education programmes;
- (e) to create centres of excellence for research and development and for sharing knowledge and its application;
- (f) to maintain the standards of degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions in accordance with the norms laid down by the University Grants Commission and the related regulatory body or regulatory council;
- (g) to pursue any other objective as may be approved by the State Government based on the recommendations of the Regulatory Commission from time to time.

4. (1) An application containing the proposal and the project report to establish a private university for carrying out the objectives enumerated in Section 3 shall be made by the sponsoring body to the Regulatory Commission along with such fee and in such form as may be prescribed.

Submission of proposal for establishment of a private university.

(2) The project report shall contain the following particulars, namely —

- (a) the details of the sponsoring body along with the copies of its registration certificate, constitution and bye-laws;
- (b) the information regarding financial resources of the sponsoring body along with audited accounts for the previous five years;
- (c) the location of the main campus of the proposed private university;
- (d) the objective of the private university;
- (e) availability of land, and details of building and infrastructure facilities;
- (f) the details of plans for campus development such as construction of buildings, development of structural amenities and infrastructure facilities and procurement of equipment etc. to be undertaken before the private university starts functioning and the phase-wise programme for five years;
- (g) raised outlays of capital expenditure proposed for five years and its sources of finance;
- (h) the nature and the number of faculties such as Science, Arts, Commerce, Technology, Education etc. types of programmes (under graduate or post graduate) of study and research proposed to be undertaken by the private university in each faculty and phasing of such programme for five year with course wise enrollment targets;

- (i) the experience and expertise in the concerned discipline in the command of the sponsoring body;
- (j) availabilities of academic facilities such as teaching staff, technical or non-technical staff, equipments etc., required for the courses of study and research;
- (k) the estimated recurring expenditure course wise or activity wise, sources of finance and estimated expenditure per student;
- (l) the scheme for mobilizing resources and the cost of capital thereto and the manner of repayment to such sources;
- (m) the scheme for generation of funds internally through the recovery of fee from students, revenues anticipated from other activities relating to the objects of the private university and other anticipated income;
- (n) the proposed fee structure for the different courses with reference to the detail of expenditure in unit cost and the extent of concessions or rebates in fee or free-ships and scholarships, if any, for the students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes and below poverty line families;
- (o) the system proposed to be followed for selection of students for admission to the courses of study in the private university;
- (p) the system proposed to be followed for appointment of teachers and other employees in the private university.
- Evaluation of proposal.** 5. (1) The Regulatory Commission shall, on receipt of the proposal and the project report for establishment of a private university, make such scrutiny within 60 days from the receipt of proposal as to the facts stated in the project report, as it may deem necessary.
- (2) The Regulatory Commission in course of scrutiny may ask for any additional information from the sponsoring body and after receipt of such information, the Regulatory Commission shall evaluate the project proposal within 90 days.
- Issuing letter of intent.** 6. (1) After inquiry and evaluation as provided in Section 5, if the Regulatory Commission is of the opinion that an opportunity to establish a private university be given to the sponsoring body, it shall make its recommendation to the State Government to issue a letter of intent to the sponsoring body in this regard.
- (2) After receiving the recommendation from the Regulatory Commission, the State Government may issue letter of intent to the sponsoring body with regard to establishment of private university in the State.
- Conditions for establishing private university.** 7. The letter of intent as provided in sub-section (2) of Section 6, shall contain the following conditions, which the sponsoring body will be required to fulfil for establishing a private university in the State, namely—
- (i) it shall establish—
- (a) main campus;
- (b) an endowment fund in accordance with the provision of Section 11;
- (ii) it shall procure a minimum 20 hectares of land for the main campus to be established, and submit its ownership papers;
- (iii) it shall make available a minimum builtup area of 25,00 square metres in the form of buildings, and ancillary structures for administrative purposes and for conducting the academic programmes;
- (iv) it shall give an undertaking to the following effect—
- (a) that the private university shall be unitary and self-financing;
- (b) that the land and buildings of the private university shall be used for the purposes of the private university only;
- (c) that it shall appoint, immediately after incorporation of the private university, and before starting of the classes, adequate number of faculty members along with necessary supporting staff in each department or discipline.

- (d) that it shall take up co-curricular activities to foster a proper academic and healthy environment such as seminars, debates, quiz programmes and extracurricular activities like games, sports, National Service Scheme, National Cadet Corps etc, for the benefit of students as per the norms laid down by the regulatory bodies;
- (e) that it shall establish welfare programmes for the employees of the private university;
- (f) that it shall fulfil such other conditions and provide such other information as may be prescribed by the central regulatory bodies from time to time;
- (g) that it shall fulfil the minimum criteria in terms of programme, faculty, infrastructure facilities, financial viability etc, laid down from time to time by the regulatory bodies;
- (h) that it shall frame the programme or study leading to graduate and postgraduate degree or diploma which shall conform to the relevant regulations and norms of the University Grants Commission or the concerned statutory bodies;
- (i) that it shall determine the admission procedure and fixation of fees in accordance with the norms or guidelines of the regulatory bodies;
- (j) it shall compulsorily be assessed and accredited by the National Council of Assessment and Accreditation;
- (k) that the teaching staff of the private university shall have minimum qualification prescribed by the University Grants Commission or other concerned regulatory bodies and appropriate emoluments shall be paid to them;
- (l) that the private university shall be open to all persons of either gender, and it shall not discriminate on grounds of caste, creed, religion, race and it shall not be lawful for the private university to adopt or impose on any person any test whatsoever of religious belief in order to entitle him to be appointed as a teacher of the private university or to hold any other office therein or be admitted as a student in the private university or to enjoy or exercise any privilege thereof;
- (m) that the admissions and conduct of classes shall not be started till concerned Statutes and Ordinances are approved as per provisions of the Act.

K. (1) The sponsoring body shall submit the compliance report and an undertaking along with the relevant documents to the Regulatory Commission.

Submission of compliance report, verification and inspection.

(2) After receiving the compliance report from the sponsoring body, the Regulatory Commission shall examine the same and factual data in the manner it may deem fit.

(3) If the Regulatory Commission, after examination of the compliance report and the undertaking as mentioned under sub-section (2), finds any shortcomings in the same, it may direct the sponsoring body to remove the identified shortcomings at the earliest.

(4) The Regulatory Commission, on being satisfied that the identified shortcomings, as mentioned in sub-section (3), have been removed it shall send its report regarding status of the proposal for establishment of the private university to the State Government regarding removal of the identified shortcomings.

(5) The State Government, may after the receipt of the report from the Regulatory Commission mentioned in sub-section (4), ask the University Grants Commission for inspection of the proposed private university, and the University Grants Commission shall submit the report within a maximum period of three months, or else the State Government may take such decision as it may deem fit.

(6) If the sponsoring body fails to comply with the conditions laid down in Section 7 within the stipulated time, the project proposal submitted under sub-section (1) of Section 4 shall be annulled and letter of intent issued under sub-section (2) of Section 6 shall be canceled.

Establishment and incorporation 9. (1) The State Government, if satisfied, after considering the report submitted by the Regulatory Commission under Section 8 and inspection report of the University Grants Commission, if any, that the sponsoring body has complied with the provisions of Section 7 and a private university may be established on the basis of its proposal, shall establish, by amending the Schedule, a private university with such specific name and description as specified in this behalf in the Schedule.

(2) Such a private university shall be deemed to have been incorporated from the date of the amendment of the Schedule.

(3) The private university shall be a body corporate by such name as shown in the Schedule having perpetual succession and common seal with powers, subject to the provisions of this Act, to acquire and own property, to contract, and shall sue and be sued by the said name.

(4) In all the suits and other legal proceedings by or against such private university, the pleadings shall be signed and verified by the Registrar and all processes in such suits and proceedings shall be issued to and be served on the Registrar.

(5) The main campus of the private university shall be at such place as shown in column 15) of the Schedule.

CHAPTER III—OPERATION AND MANAGEMENT OF PRIVATE UNIVERSITY

Incentives to private university. 10. Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (a) of clause (iv) of Section 7, the Government may provide financial or other incentives to the private university for reasons to be recorded in writing.

Endowment fund. 11. (1) On receipt of the letter of intent from the State Government as provided under sub-section (2) of Section 6, a sponsoring body, willing to fulfil the conditions and give undertaking as mentioned in the letter of intent, shall establish an endowment fund of five crore rupees within fifteen days as a perpetual deposit in any bank specified in the First Schedule to the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Act, 1970 (5 of 1970), as a corresponding new bank.

(2) The endowment fund shall be used as security deposit to ensure that the private university complies with the provisions of the Act, Statutes and Ordinances, and the State Government may forfeit, after giving notice, whole or part of endowment fund on the recommendation of the Regulatory Commission, in case of breach or contravention of any provision of this Act, Statute, Ordinance or regulation by the sponsoring body.

(3) Income from the endowment fund may be utilized for development of infrastructure of the private university, but shall not be utilized for recurring expenditure of the private university.

(4) The mode of establishment of endowment fund, the manner of its investment, the payment of income from it to the sponsoring body, its forfeiture and mode of its return to the sponsoring body shall be such as may be prescribed.

General fund. 12. Every private university shall establish a fund, which shall be called the general fund to which the following shall be credited, namely:—

- (a) fees and other charges received by the private university;
- (b) any contribution made by the sponsoring body;

- (c) trusts, bequests, donations, endowments and any other grants; and
- (d) all other sums received by the private university.

Provided that one percent of the fees collected from the students under clause (a), shall be deposited with the Regulatory Commission in such manner as may be prescribed.

13. The general fund shall be utilized for the following purposes, namely:—

Application of general fund.

- (a) repayment of debts including interest charged thereto incurred by the private university for the purposes of this Act and the Statutes, Ordinances and regulations made thereunder;
- (b) upkeep of the assets of the private university;
- (c) payment of the cost of audit of the funds created under Sections 11 and 12;
- (d) meeting the expenses of any suit or proceedings in the court to which private university is a party;
- (e) payment of salaries, allowances, provident fund contributions, gratuity and other benefits to officers and employees and members of the teaching and research staff;
- (f) payment of travelling and other allowances to the members of the governing body, the Board of Management, the Academic Council and other authorities so declared under the Statutes of the private university and to the member of any committee appointed by any of the authorities or by the Chairperson of the sponsoring body or the Vice-Chancellor, in pursuance of any provision of the Act, and Statutes, Ordinances or regulations made thereunder;
- (g) payment of fellowships, free-ships, scholarships, assistantships and other awards to the students belonging to below poverty line families or research associates or trainees, as the case may be, or to any students otherwise eligible for such awards under the provisions of this Act and Statutes, Ordinances, regulation or rules made thereunder;
- (h) payment of any expense incurred by the private university in carrying out the provisions of this Act and the Statutes, Ordinances or the regulations made thereunder;
- (i) payment of cost of capital not exceeding the applicable bank rates of interest, incurred by the sponsoring body for setting up the private university and the investments made therefor;
- (j) payment of any other expenses including service fee payable to any organization charged with the responsibility of providing any specific service, including the managerial services to the private university on behalf of the sponsoring body as approved by the Board of Management to be an expense for the purposes of the private university.

Provided that no expenditure shall be incurred by the private university in excess of the limit for total recurring expenditure and total non-recurring expenditure for the year as fixed by the Board of Management, without the prior approval of the Board of management.

Provided further that the general fund shall not be utilized for the objects specified under clause (a) without the prior approval of the governing body of the private university.

14. The following shall be the officers of the private university, namely:—

Officers of private university.

- (a) the Visitor;
- (b) the Chancellor;
- (c) the Vice-Chancellor;

	<p>(d) the Registrar;</p> <p>(e) the Chief Finance and Accounts Officer; and</p> <p>(f) such other officers as may be declared by the Statutes to be the officers of the private university.</p>
Visitor.	<p>15. (1) The Governor of Madhya Pradesh shall be the Visitor of the private university.</p> <p>(2) The Visitor shall when present, preside at the convocation of the private university for conferring degrees and diplomas.</p> <p>(3) The Visitor shall have the following powers, namely:—</p> <p>(a) to call for any information or record relating to the affairs of the private university;</p> <p>(b) if it appears on the basis of the information that any order, proceeding or decision taken by any authority of the private university is not in conformity with the provisions of this Act and Statutes, Ordinances or regulations made thereunder, the Visitor may ask for the opinion of the Regulatory Commission and on being satisfied that any irregularity has taken place, he may issue such direction as he may deem fit in the interest of the private university and the directions so issued shall be complied with by the private university.</p>
Chancellor.	<p>16. (1) The Chancellor shall be appointed by the sponsoring body with the approval of the Visitor.</p> <p>(2) The Chancellor shall be the head of the private university.</p> <p>(3) The Chancellor shall preside over the meeting of the governing body and shall, when the Visitor is not present, preside over the convocation of the private university for conferring degrees, diplomas or other academic distinctions.</p> <p>(4) The Chancellor shall have the following powers, namely:—</p> <p>(a) to appoint and remove the Vice-Chancellor;</p> <p>(b) to call for any information or record;</p> <p>(c) such other powers as may be conferred by the Statutes.</p>
Vice-Chancellor.	<p>17. (1) The Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor from the panel recommended by the selection committee constituted for the purpose.</p> <p>(2) The selection committee, referred to in sub-section (1), shall consist of the following members, namely:—</p> <p>(i) two eminent academicians nominated by the sponsoring body; and</p> <p>(ii) one eminent person nominated by the State Government.</p> <p>(3) The Chancellor shall appoint one of the members of the selection committee as Chairman.</p> <p>(4) The selection committee shall submit a panel of at least three eminent persons for the appointment of Vice-Chancellor.</p> <p>Provided that if the Chancellor does not approve the recommendation of the selection committee, he may call for fresh recommendation from the selection committee.</p> <p>(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing sub-sections, the Chancellor may appoint the first Vice-Chancellor for a period of two years to conduct the affairs of the private university.</p>

(6) The Vice-Chancellor shall, subject to the provision contained in sub-section (1), hold office for a term of four years:

Provided that a Vice-Chancellor shall continue to hold the office even after expiry of his term till a new Vice-Chancellor joins, however in any case this period shall not exceed 6 months.

(7) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the principal executive and academic officer of the private university and shall exercise general superintendence and control over the affairs of the private university and shall execute the decisions of various authorities of the private university.

(8) The Vice-Chancellor shall preside at the convocation of the private university in the absence of the Visitor and the Chancellor.

(9) If in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor it is necessary to take immediate action on any matter for which powers are conferred on any other authority by or under this Act, he may take such action as he deems necessary, and shall at the earliest opportunity thereafter report his action to such officer or authority as would have in the ordinary course dealt with the matter:

Provided that if in the opinion of the concerned officer or authority such action should not have been taken by the Vice-Chancellor, then such case shall be referred to the Chancellor, whose decision thereon shall be final:

Provided further that where any such action taken by the Vice-Chancellor affect any person in the service of the private university, such person shall be entitled to prefer, within three months from the date on which such action communicated to him, an appeal to the governing body and the decision of the governing body shall be communicated to the person concerned within three months from the date of appeal.

(10) If in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor, the decision of any authority of the private university is not in conformity with the power conferred by this Act and Statutes, Ordinances or Regulations made thereunder or is likely to be prejudicial to the interests of the private university, he shall request the concerned authority to revise its decision and in case the authority refuses to revise such decision wholly or partly or fails to take any decision within fifteen days, then such matter shall be decided by the Chancellor.

(11) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed by the Statutes and the Ordinances.

(12) If at any time upon representation made or otherwise, it appears to the Chancellor that the Vice-Chancellor—

- (a) has made default in performing any duty imposed on him by or under this Act;
- or
- (b) has acted in a manner prejudicial to the interest of the private university; or
- (c) is incapable of managing the affairs of the private university.

the Chancellor may, notwithstanding the fact that the term of office of Vice-Chancellor has not expired, by an order in writing stating the reasons therein require the Vice-Chancellor to relinquish his office from such date as may be specified in the order.

(13) No order under sub-section (12) shall be passed unless the particulars of the grounds on which such action is proposed to be taken are communicated to the Vice-Chancellor and he is given reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the proposed order.

(14) As from the date specified in the order under sub section (12), the Vice-Chancellor shall be deemed to have relinquished the office and the office of the Vice-Chancellor shall fall vacant.

12) The Chancellor shall be the *Ex-officio* Chairman of the governing body.

(1) The governing body shall be the principal authority of the private university and all movable and immovable property of the private university shall vest in the governing body and it shall have the following powers, namely:—

- (a) to control functioning of the private university by using all such powers as are provided by this Act or the Statutes, Ordinances or regulations made thereunder;
- (b) to review the decisions of other authorities of the private university, in case they are not in conformity with the provisions of this Act or the Statutes, Ordinances or regulations made thereunder;
- (c) to approve the budget and annual report of the private university;
- (d) to lay down the policies to be followed by the private university;
- (e) to recommend to the sponsoring body the liquidation of the private university, if a situation arises when the functioning of the private university is not possible; and
- (f) such other powers as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

(4) The governing body shall meet at least three times in a calendar year.

(5) The quorum for meeting of the governing body shall be five members.

23. (1) The Board of Management shall consist of the following members, namely:—

Board of Management.

- (a) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (b) two representatives nominated by the sponsoring body;
- (c) two representatives nominated by the State Government;
- (d) two senior most professors of the private university by rotation; and
- (e) two senior most teachers of the private university other than in clause (d), by rotation.

(2) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the *Ex-officio* Chairperson of the Board of Management.

(3) The powers and functions of the Board of Management shall be such as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

(4) The Board of Management shall meet at least once in every two months.

(5) The quorum for meeting of the Board of Management shall be five members.

24. (1) The Academic Council shall consist of the Vice-Chancellor and such other members as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

Academic Council.

(2) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the Chairperson of the Academic Council.

(3) The Academic Council shall be the principal academic body of the private university and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances and regulations, coordinate and exercise general supervision over the academic policies of the private university.

(4) The quorum for meeting of the Academic Council shall be such as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

25. The composition, constitution, powers and functions of other authorities of the private university shall be such as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

Other authorities.

First Statutes.

26. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act and the rules made thereunder, the first Statutes of the private university may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:—

- (a) the constitution, powers and functions of the authorities and other bodies of the private university as may be constituted from time to time;
- (b) the terms and conditions of appointment of the Vice-Chancellor and his powers and functions;
- (c) the manner and terms and conditions of appointment of the Registrar, Chief Finance and Accounts Officer and other officers and their powers and functions;
- (d) the manner and terms and conditions of appointment of teachers;
- (e) the manner and terms and conditions of services of employees of the private university;
- (f) the procedure for arbitration in case of dispute between officers, teachers, employees and students;
- (g) the conferment of honorary degrees;
- (h) the provision regarding exemption of students from payment of tuition fee and for awarding to them scholarship and fellowships;
- (i) the provisions regarding the policy of admission, including regulation of reservation of seats, specially for students of below poverty line family, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, physically handicapped and other categories;
- (j) the provisions regarding fee to be charged from students and concession for the categories mentioned in clause (i);
- (k) the provision regarding number of seats in different courses.

(2) The first Statutes of the private university shall be made by the governing body and shall be submitted to the Regulatory Commission for approval.

(3) The Regulatory Commission shall consider the first Statutes submitted by the private university within two months from the date of its receipt and shall give its approval with such modifications as it may deem necessary.

(4) The private university shall communicate its consent to the first Statutes as approved by the Regulatory Commission and if it desires not to give effect to the modification made by the Regulatory Commission under sub-section (3), it may give the reasons therefor and the Regulatory Commission may or may not accept the suggestion made by the private university.

Subsequent Statutes.

27. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act and the rules made thereunder, the subsequent Statutes of the private university may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:—

- (a) creations of new authorities of the private university;
- (b) accounting policy and financial procedure;
- (c) representation of teachers in the authorities of the private university;
- (d) creation of new departments and abolition or restructuring of existing departments;
- (e) institution of medals and prizes;
- (f) creation of posts and procedure for their abolition;
- (g) revision of fee;
- (h) alteration of the number of seats in different courses; and
- (i) all other matters which under the provision of this Act are to be prescribed by the Statutes.

(2) The Statutes of the private university, other than the first Statutes, shall be made by the Board of Management with the approval of the governing body.

(3) The Statutes made under sub-section (2) shall be sent to the Regulatory Commission

and the Regulatory Commission may, if it considers necessary, give suggestions for modifications in it within two months from the date of receipt of the Statutes.

(4) The governing body shall consider the modifications suggested by the Regulatory Commission and return the Statute to the Regulatory Commission with its comments on the suggestions.

(5) The Regulatory Commission shall consider the suggestions made by the governing body and the Statutes, as finally approved by the Regulatory Commission, shall come into force.

28. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act and the rules or Statutes made thereunder, the first Ordinance may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:—

- (a) admission of students to the private university and their admission, mentioning thereby special consideration for the students of the specified categories;
- (b) details of courses of study to be prescribed for the degrees, diplomas and certificates of the private university;
- (c) award of the degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions, the minimum qualifications for the same and the means to be adopted relating to the granting and obtaining of the same;
- (d) conditions for award of fellowships, scholarships, stipends, medals and prizes;
- (e) conduct of examinations, including the terms of office, manner of appointment, and the duties of examiner bodies, examiners and moderators;
- (f) examination fees to be charged for the various courses for degrees and diplomas of the private university;
- (g) conditions of residence of the students of the private university;
- (h) provisions regarding disciplinary action against the students;
- (i) creation, composition and functions of any other body which is considered necessary for improving the academic environment of the private university;
- (j) manner of co-operative and collaboration with other universities and institutions of higher education; and
- (k) all other matters which by this Act or Statutes made thereunder are required to be provided by the Ordinances.

(2) The first Ordinances of the private university shall be made by the Vice-Chancellor which shall be submitted to the Regulatory Commission for approval.

(3) The Regulatory Commission shall consider the first Ordinances submitted by the Vice-Chancellor under sub-section (2) within two months from the date of its receipt and shall either approve it or give suggestions for modifications.

(4) The Vice-Chancellor shall give his comments on the suggestions made by the Regulatory Commission and shall return the first Ordinance to the Commission and on receipt of the same, the Commission shall either approve the comments of the Vice-Chancellor or disapprove the same, and on the basis of the final decision, the Ordinance, as approved by the Regulatory Commission, shall come into force.

29. All Ordinances, other than the first Ordinances, shall be made by the Academic Council with the approval of the Board of Management.

Provided that amendment of the first Ordinances shall be made after the approval of the Regulatory Commission.

First Ordinances

Subsequent Ordinances

Vacancies not to invalidate the proceedings of any authority or body of private university.

30. No act or proceeding of any authority or body of the private university shall be invalid merely by reason of any vacancy or defect in the constitution thereof.

Filling up of emergent vacancies.

31. Vacancies arising in the members of authorities or bodies of the private university due to death, resignation or removal of a member or due to change of capacity in which he was appointed or nominated shall be filled up as early as possible by the person or the body who had appointed or nominated such a member :

Provided that the person appointed or nominated as a member of an authority or body of the private university on an emergent vacancy shall remain member of such authority or body for only the remaining tenure of the member in whose place he is appointed or nominated.

Committees.

32. The authorities or officers of the private university may constitute such committees with such term of reference as may be necessary for specific tasks to be performed by such committees and the constitution of such committees and their duties shall be such as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

Made of proof of private university record.

33. A copy of any receipt, application, notice, order, proceeding or resolution of any authority or committee of the private university or other document in possession of the private university, if certified by the Registrar shall be treated a prima facie evidence of such receipt, application, notice, order, proceeding, resolution or document or the existence of entry in the register and shall be admitted as evidence of the matter and transaction therein where the original thereof would if produced have been admissible in evidence.

Regulations.

34. (1) The authorities of the private university constituted by or under this Act may make regulations subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances of the private university.

(2) The Board of Management may modify or annul any regulations made under this section by any authority.

Enforcement of Statutes, Ordinances and regulations.

35. All Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations shall come into force from their publication in the official Gazette.

CHAPTER IV—REGULATION OF PRIVATE UNIVERSITY

Regulatory Commission.

36. (1) A Regulatory Commission shall be established by the State Government for the purpose of providing a regulatory mechanism at the State level and for working as an interface between the State Government and the central regulatory bodies for the purpose of ensuring appropriate standards of teaching, examination, research, extension programme, protection of interest of the students and reasonable service conditions of the employees.

(2) The Regulatory Commission shall function under the general control of the Visitor.

(3) The Regulatory Commission shall consist of a Chairman and two full time members, out of which one member shall be member academic and another member as member administration and not exceeding two part time members.

(4) The Regulatory Commission shall have a full time or part time Secretary.

(5) The Chairman shall be appointed by the Visitor from a panel recommended by the State Government consisting of eminent educationists who have a thorough knowledge of the working of the institutions of higher education.

(6) The member and the Secretary shall be appointed by the Visitor from a panel recommended by the State Government consisting of persons of repute in the field of education, finance, law, administration and management.

(7) The Chairman and the members shall not be connected in any way with any of the private universities established under this Act.

(8) The Chairman and member of the Regulatory Commission shall hold office for a term of three years and two years respectively from the date on which he enters upon his office, or until he attains the age of sixty-five years, whichever is earlier, and he shall be eligible to be considered for a second term of aforesaid years, subject to the upper age limit of sixty-five years.

Provided that notwithstanding the expiry of the said period of three years or two years, as the case may be, he shall continue in office until his successor is appointed and enters upon his office, but such period shall not exceed six months.

Provided further that after the expiry of the term, the Chairman and the member of the Regulatory Commission shall be prohibited to accept any pecuniary benefits in any form or in any name whatsoever, and any assignment or employment in any of the private universities established under this Act.

(9) The other terms and conditions of services of the Chairman and the members, mode of authentication of orders and decisions of the Regulatory Commission and instrument issued by the Regulatory Commission, procedure for meeting of the Regulatory Commission, recruitment and service conditions of the staff of the Regulatory Commission, temporary, association of persons with the Regulatory Commission for particular purpose, fund of the Regulatory Commission, its budget, annual report, accounts, audit and such other matter as may be required for proper functioning of the Regulatory Commission shall be provided in the rules made by the State Government in this regard.

(10) It shall be the general duty of the Regulatory Commission—

- (a) to take all such steps as it considers necessary for determination and maintenance of standards of teaching, examination and research in the private university;
- (b) notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, to ensure that private universities collect only such fees and other charges, which cover the cost of education imparted by them and also give a reasonable surplus to enable them to maintain assets and carry out further expansion;
- (c) to ensure that the teachers of the private university have at least the minimum educational qualifications prescribed by the University Grants Commission or other regulatory bodies;
- (d) to ensure that the staff of the private university is appointed in conformity with the Statutes, Ordinances and norms or guidelines prescribed by the University Grants Commission and other concerned statutory bodies;
- (e) to ensure that students enrolled in the private university are not exploited and no unethical means are adopted to collect undue or excessive fee from them;
- (f) to take action pertaining to and pursuant upon liquidation of a private university including arrangement for completion of courses, conduct of examinations, award of degrees etc. by assigning the job to some other State university in such a manner that the interest of the students are not adversely affected and the expenditure made for these arrangements for the students along with the proceeds of liquidation of the private university shall be made good from the money deposited in the endowment fund and/or general fund.

(11) The State Government may issue directions on matters of policy to the Regulatory Commission which shall be binding.

Annual report.

37. (1) The annual report of the private university shall be prepared by the Board of Management which shall include, among other matters, the steps taken by the private university towards the fulfillment of the objectives and shall be approved by the governing body and a copy of the same shall be submitted to the sponsoring body.

(2) Copies of the annual report, prepared under sub-section (1), shall also be presented to the Visitor and the Regulatory Commission.

Annual account and audit.

38. (1) The annual accounts including balance sheet of the private university shall be prepared under the directions of the Board of Management and the annual accounts shall be audited at least once every year by the auditors appointed by the private university for the purpose.

(2) A copy of the annual accounts together with the audit report shall be submitted to the governing body.

(3) A copy of the annual accounts and audit report along with the observations, if any, of the governing body shall be submitted to the Visitor and the Regulatory Commission.

(4) The Regulatory Commission shall examine the annual report and accounts and audit report and the directions of the Regulatory Commission on the subject arising out of the annual report and accounts and audit report of the private university shall be binding on the private university.

Periodic inspection.

39. (1) The University Grants Commission may cause periodic inspection of the private university, and for this purpose the University Grants Commission may call for all relevant information from the concerned private university, as provided in the University Grants Commission (Returns and Information by Universities) Rules, 1979 as amended from time to time.

(2) After inspection and assessment of a private university providing graduate degree, post graduate degree and/ or diploma courses, the University Grants Commission may indicate to the private university any deficiency and non-conformity with the relevant University Grants Commission regulations and give it reasonable opportunity to rectify the same and if the University Grants Commission is satisfied that the private university has even after getting an opportunity to do so, failed to comply with the provisions of any of the regulations, the University Grants Commission may pass an order prohibiting the private university from offering any course for the award of the graduate degree, post graduate degree and / or diploma, as the case may be, till the deficiency is rectified.

(3) The University Grants Commission may take action against the private university for awarding a graduate degree, post graduate degree or diploma which is not specified by the University Grants Commission, and inform the public in general through a notification and a private university continuing such programme and awarding unspecified degrees shall be liable for penalty under Section 24 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956).

CHAPTER V—WINDING OF PRIVATE UNIVERSITY**Management of private university on dissolution of sponsoring body.**

40. (1) If the sponsoring body proposes to dissolve itself or wants to discontinue the function of the private university established under this Act, it shall inform the Regulatory Commission of its puzn by which it shall ensure completion of courses and conduct of examinations, and it shall announce the prospective date from which it shall not admit any new students.

(2) The Regulatory Commission, on receipt of such information, shall have the right to issue such directions to the sponsoring body for the fulfilment of its obligations under sub-section (1) as it may deem necessary, and if the sponsoring body contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1), the endowment fund shall be forfeited by the Regulatory Commission and the Regulatory Commission shall make arrangements for completion of courses, conduct of examinations, award of degrees, etc. of students of the private university, either by undertaking the job itself or by assigning the job to some other university in such manner that the interest of the students are not

affected adversely in any manner and expenditure made for those arrangement for the students shall be made good from the money deposited in the endowment fund and/or general fund of the private university.

41 (1) On report of the Regulatory Commission or otherwise if it appears to the State Government that a situation of financial mismanagement and maladministration has arisen in the private university, it shall issue notice requiring the private university to show cause within forty five days as to,—

Special powers of State Government in certain circumstances.

- (a) why an order of its liquidation should not be made;
- (b) why the Board of Management should not be suspended and an Administrator be appointed under sub-section (7).

(2) If the State Government considers it necessary to suspend the Board of Management, it shall, by notification published in the official Gazette, order suspension of the Board Management and shall make such arrangement in consultation with the sponsoring body for the administration of the business of the private university, as it may consider necessary.

(3) If the State Government, on receipt of reply of the private university in respect of notice issued under sub-section (1), is satisfied that there is a prima facie case of financial mismanagement, maladministration or violation of any of the provisions of this Act, or director issued thereunder, it shall make an order of such enquiry as it may consider necessary.

(4) The State Government shall, for the purpose of any enquiry under sub-section (3), appoint an officer or authority to enquire into any of the allegations and make report thereon.

(5) The enquiring authorities appointed under sub-section (4) shall have the same power as are vested in a civil court under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 (45 of 1908) while trying a suit in respect of the following matters, namely :—

- (a) summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person and examining him;
- (b) requiring the discovery and production of any document or material as may be required;
- (c) requisitioning any public record from any court or office;
- (d) any other matter which may be prescribed.

(6) Every enquiring authority enquiring under this Act shall be deemed to be a civil court for the purposes of Section 195 and Chapter XVI of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (2 of 1974).

(7) If the State Government, on receipt of the enquiry report, is satisfied that owing to financial mismanagement and maladministration a situation has arisen due to which the financial stability or administration of the private university has become insecure, it shall, by notification in the official Gazette, order liquidation of the private university or may cause the functioning of the private university to continue by appointing an Administrator who shall have the powers vested in the governing body.

Provided that no order of liquidation shall take effect unless the entry relating to such private university is deleted from the Schedule to this Act.

(8) While issuing notification in respect of liquidation under sub-section (7), the State Government shall till the end of current courses, make arrangement for the administration of business of the private university.

(9) The State Government during the period of management of private university under sub-section (8) shall use the fund available with the private university and the surplus, if any, shall be forfeited.

(10) All the expenses incurred in the process of enquiry and till the completion of admission of the students shall be met from the endowment fund or general fund of the private university.

मध्यप्रदेश निजी विश्वविद्यालय (स्थापना एवं संचालन) अधिनियम, २००७ (क्रमांक १७ सन् २००७) की धारा ५ में यह उपबंधित है कि इस अधिनियम के अधीन गठित विनियामक आयोग, राज्य में निजी विश्वविद्यालय को स्थापना किए जाने के प्रस्ताव का मूल्यांकन करेगा। उक्त उपबंध के आलोक में, विनियामक आयोग ने प्रेस्टीज विश्वविद्यालय, इन्दौर, एक्सम विश्वविद्यालय, भीमल, (अब परिवर्तित नाम सुभम् विश्वविद्यालय, भीमल है), डॉ. प्रीति ग्लोबल विश्वविद्यालय, शिवपुरी तथा एन. एन. सी. डी. विद्यापीठ विश्वविद्यालय, इंदौर के नाम से निजी विश्वविद्यालयों को स्थापित करने की अनुरोध की है। उक्त अधिनियम की धारा ६ के आलोक में, राज्य सरकार ने उक्त विश्वविद्यालयों को स्थापना के संबंध में, विश्वविद्यालयों के प्रायोगी विकास को आगम-पत्र जारी कर दिये हैं। उक्त अधिनियम की धारा-९ में यह उपबंध है कि विनियामक आयोग द्वारा प्रस्तुत रिपोर्ट पर विचारण करने पर संतुष्ट होने के पश्चात्, उक्त अधिनियम की अनुरूपी में उक्त नाम और विकास को समाविष्ट करके निजी विश्वविद्यालय को स्थापित किया जाएगा।

Statute 9

GOVERNING BODY

The Governing Body of the Amaltas University, Dewas shall consist of the following members, namely:

- (v) the Chancellor;
- (ii) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (iii) Three eminent persons nominated by the Sponsoring Body out of whom at least one shall be an eminent educationist.
- (iv) Three distinguished persons nominated by the Visitor out of a panel of six names submitted by the State Government;
- (v) One representative of the State Government not below the rank of Deputy Secretary.
- (vi) The Chancellor shall be the Ex-officio chairman of the Governing Body.
- (vii) The Registrar will be the Member Secretary of Governing Body.

TENURE:

The term of a nominated member of the Governing Body shall be three years and no nominated members shall hold office for more than two consecutive terms.

POWERS:

The Governing Body shall be the principal authority of the University and all movable and immovable properties of the university shall vest in the Governing Body and it shall have the following powers, namely:

- (a) The first Statutes of the University shall be made by the Governing Body and shall be submitted to the Regulatory Commission for approval.
- (b) To control functioning of the University by using all such powers as are provided by Act, The Adhiniyam and the Statutes, Ordinances or Regulations made there under.
- (c) To review the decision of other authorities of the University, in case they are not in conformity with the provisions of the Adhiniyam or the Statutes, Ordinances or Regulations made there under.
- (d) To approve the budget and annual report of the University.

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- (e) To lay down the policies to be followed by the University.
- (f) To recommend to the Sponsoring Body the liquidation of the University provided a situation arises when the functioning of the University is not possible.
- (g) The Governing Body shall, in the interest of the University, have powers to constitute committee/s and nominate members thereto and decide on the terms of reference and other conditions of functions of the committee/s.
- (h) The Governing Body shall have the power to review, if necessary, the acts of other authorities of the University, save where such authorities have acted in accordance with the powers conferred upon these by the Adhiniyam, the Statutes and the Ordinances.
- (i) Such other powers as may be prescribed by the Statutes, as per the provision of the Act 2007 amended from time to time.

FUNCTIONS:

The Governing Body shall be:

- (a) The highest policy making body of the University and shall be responsible for the general supervision, direction and control of the work of the University so that the University fulfills its Mission.
- (b) Shall exercise all powers under The Adhiniyam unless otherwise prohibited by the Statutes or Ordinances.
- (c) The final approving authority for all the University Statutes and Ordinances, It shall have the power to reject or send for reconsideration any Statutes or Ordinances received from the Vice-Chancellor, Board of Management. It shall also have the powers to review any Statutes or Ordinances and Regulations on its own.
- (d) may invite expert/s or person/s having special knowledge to obtain information or views on an academic matter of common or special interest to any or all the body and institutions of the University.
- (e) Subject to Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances, the Governing Body may take steps to dispose of matter referred to it by the Sponsoring Body.
- (f) May make policy, direction/ recommendation/s to any Authority of the University.
- (g) May receive complaints and decide on the matter and their disposal.

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- (h) Shall consider and, if necessary, take decision/pass resolution on the Annual Report of the University, including the financial accounts and estimates as submitted by the Board of Management.
- (i) Shall direct, supervise and control the endowment fund' as also general fund account and have them audited as per the Adhiniyam.
- (j) Shall periodically review the Broad decisions and programs of the University and direct/suggest measures to improve and develop the University.
- (k) Shall be the final authority to approve the recommendation of the Board for conferment of honorary degree and other distinctions and awards.
- (l) The Governing Body may order in writing, annul any order, notification, resolution or any proceedings of the University, which, in its opinion, are not in conformity with the provisions of the Adhiniyam, or the Statutes, Ordinances or Regulations.
- (m) Shall frame rules/regulations for the conduct of its business.

MEETINGS AND QUORUM:

- (a) A meeting of the Governing Body shall ordinarily be called three times, in a calendar year.
- (b) Meeting of the Governing Body shall be called under the directions of the Chairperson and in his/her absence by a nominated member from the Chairperson.
- (c) The Chairperson may, on his/her own or on the directions of the Sponsoring Body, call a Special Meeting as and when required in the interest of the University.
- (d) Seven (7) clear days notice shall ordinarily be required for a meeting. The chairperson, may however at his discretion, dispense with this requirement in the interest of the University.
- (e) Five members of the Governing Body shall form the Quorum. Provided that, three members will form the quorum for an adjourned meeting.

VACANCIES:

- (a) Any member of the Governing Body may resign his/her office. The letter of resignation in writing shall be sent to the Chancellor. Such resignation shall take effect immediately on its acceptance and communication to the member concerned.

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- (b) No member of the Governing Body, who is nominated to another Body in his/her capacity as a member of the Body, shall continue to be a member of that Body after his/her removal or the acceptance of his/her resignation.
- (c) A member of the Governing Body of the University shall automatically cease to be member on his being convicted by a Court of law for any offence including moral turpitude.
- (d) Vacancy of a Member arising by reason of death, resignation, and removal or otherwise shall be filled as soon as possible by the Sponsoring Body and the Member so nominated shall be a Member for the un-expired portion of the term.

Statute 10

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

CONSTITUTION:

There shall be a Board of Management of the University, duly constituted under Section 23(1) read with Section 23(3) of the Adhiniyam; It shall consist of the following:

- a) The Vice Chancellor, as ex officio Chairperson;
- b) Two representatives nominated by the Sponsoring Body;
- c) Two representatives nominated by the State Government;
- d) Two Principals/Senior most Professors of the Constituent Institutions by rotation;
- e) Two Senior most Teachers of University by rotation other than the clause(d) as above.
- f) Registrar: Ex-Officio Member Secretary.

2. TENURE:

- (a) The Members of the Board of Management, except those who are ex-officio, shall hold office for a period of three (3) years from the date of their nomination.
- (b) The Chairperson of the Board of Management, whose decision in the matter shall be final, shall decide any dispute or question with regard to Membership or Tenure of a Member.
- © The Vice-Chancellor will be the ex-officio Chairperson of Board of Management.

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3. POWERS AND FUNCTIONS:

The Board of Management:

- v. Shall be Principal Executive Body of the University and shall be responsible for the entire management, control and administration of the University.
- ii. The Statutes of the University, other than the first Statutes, shall be made by the Board of Management with the approval of the Governing Body.
- iii. Shall function under the policies laid down by the Governing Body and shall receive and respond to all directions from the Governing Body.
- iv. Shall ensure an integrated approach to key areas such as education policy, planning, resource mobilization and allocation, response to new opportunities, accountability and transparency of functioning in order to achieve the objectives set before the University in a democratic manner.
- v. In order to manage and administer, the functioning of the University in a smooth and efficient manner, the Board of Management shall have the powers to make Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations, either on its own or on the recommendation of any Authority or Officer of the University, subject to the conditions laid down in the Adhinyam.
- vi. Shall be the appellate authority in case of any question or dispute between a student and an employee on the one hand and any Authority or Officer of the University or Head of an Affiliated College/Institution /Study Centre on the other.
- vii. Shall regulate the use of the common seal of the University.
- viii. Shall control and administer the properties and funds of the University, including, framing of annual financial statement and estimates, annual audit, control/reduce/enhance/transfer budget allocations, borrow or lend funds with the prior approval of the Governing Body, etc. and appoint authorized agents for the same, if deemed necessary.
- ix. Shall have the authority to enter into, carry out and cancel contracts on behalf of the University in the exercise or performance of the powers and duties assigned to it under the Adhinyam or the Statutes and Ordinances.

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- x. Shall have the power to create or designate Departments of the University or affiliated colleges or institutions as laid down by the Statutes/Ordinances.
- xi. The Board of Management may, on the recommendation of the Academic Council, institute any Professorship, Readership or Lectureship or any teaching post and may abolish it.
- xii. Shall direct the preparation of the Annual Report of the University, along with the audited accounts for the year and the extent of achievement of objectives of the University. Board shall have the power to include any other item in the Report. The Board shall put the Report before the Governing Body as stipulated by Regulations.
- xiii. Shall comply with such directions as may be received from the Chairperson of the Governing Body to hold a meeting and discuss matters as specified.
 - xiv. To prescribe remunerations, emoluments, travelling and other allowances etc of examiners/invisgators and other employees appointed for examination related duties.
 - xv. To ensure maintenance of proper accounts of the properties and funds of the University;
 - xvi. To have financial accounts prepared together with audit report and annual report of the University and to place it before the Governing Body for its perusal, approval and directions.
 - xvii. To prepare the annual/supplementary budget of the University and to place it before the Governing Body for its consideration and approval.
 - xviii. To follow and monitor the budget for expenditure as approved by the Governing Body.
 - xix. To recommend to Governing Body for creating the posts of other officers of the University.
 - xx. To make regulations regarding administration and control of the institutes, hostels, libraries, laboratories, museums and other Institutions established or maintained by the University.
 - xxi. To select a common seal for the University and to provide for its custody and use;
 - xxii. To arrange for the conduct/defend of litigation by or against the University.

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- xxiii. To examine and recommend to Governing Body regarding the institute of fellowships, scholarships, studentships, exhibitions, medals and prizes on the recommendations of the Academic Council.
- xxiv. To recommend, confer honorary degree, medals and prizes on the recommendation of the Academic Council;
- xxv. To recommend, enact, amend or repeal Statutes;
- xxvi. To recommend, confer the title of Professor Emeritus on the recommendation of the Academic Council.
- xxvii. To exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be conferred or imposed upon it by the Adhinyam, Statutes, Ordinances or the Regulations.

4. POWER TO PROPOSE AND RECOMMEND AMENDMENTS OR REPEAL STATUTES/ORDINANCES/REGULATIONS:

The Statutes shall be made, amended or repealed by the Board in the manner hereinafter provided.

- (a) The Board of Management may take up for consideration of the draft of a Statute either on its own motion or on a proposal made by the Academic Council. If the Academic Council does not propose the draft, the Board shall obtain the opinion of the Academic Council thereon before considering the same.
- (b) The Board of Management shall obtain the opinion of the Finance Committee in respect of such of the Statutes involving financial implications.
- (c) The Board of Management, if it thinks necessary, may also obtain the opinion of any Officer, Authority or body of the University with regard to the draft Statute before taking it up for consideration.
- (d) Every Statute as approved by the Board of Management shall be placed before the Governing Body for Submission to the Chairperson for assent with its specific recommendations.
- (e) The Board of Management in the manner hereinafter provided may make the Ordinances.

In making the Ordinances, the Board of Management shall consult,

- v. The Boards of Studies concerned when such Ordinances affect the duties of examiners; and
- ii. The Academic Council when such Ordinances affect the courses of study, conduct of and the standard of examinations or the conditions of residence of students.

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- (g) The Board of Management shall not have power to amend the draft of any Ordinance proposed by the Academic Council but it may reject the proposal or return the draft to the Academic Council for reconsideration, either in whole or in part together with such amendments as the Board may suggest.
- (h) Where the Board of Management has rejected the draft of an Ordinance proposed by the Academic Council, the Academic Council may appeal to the Governing Body.
- (i) The Governing Body may, after obtaining the comments of the Board of Management either reject the appeal or approve the Ordinance as proposed by the Academic Council. Thereupon the Ordinance shall have effect as if made by the Board.
- (j) Every Ordinance once approved by the Board of Management shall be submitted to the Governing Body, within two weeks of making thereof for final approval. The Chancellor, may within four weeks of the receipt of Ordinance, approve the same, or return to the Board of Management along with the comments for review. The decision of the Chancellor shall be final.
- (k) The Board of Management may make Rules consistent with The Adhinyam, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the Regulations. The rules may provide for:
- (i) Giving of notice of meeting to the members of each Authority or Board, of the dates of meeting and of the business to be transacted at the meetings and also for keeping a record of the proceedings of meetings.
 - (ii) The procedure to be followed at meetings and the number of members required to form the quorum for meetings; and
 - (iii) All matters solely concerning such Authority or Board and not provided for by the Adhinyam, the Statutes, the Ordinances or the Regulations.
 - (iv) Every Rule made under this section shall come into force on the date it is approved by the Board.

5. MEETINGS AND QUORUM:

- a) The Board of Management shall meet at least once in every two month. The Vice Chancellor may, in case of urgency, convene a special Meeting.
- b) The meeting shall be convened under the direction of the Vice Chancellor.
- c) Five members shall constitute the quorum.

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6. VACANCIES:

- a) Any Member of the Board of Management may resign from his office. The letter of resignation in writing shall be sent to the Chairperson of the Board of Management. Such resignation shall take effect immediately on its acceptance and communication to the member concerned.
- b) No member of the Board of Management, who is nominated to another Body in his capacity as a member of the Board shall continue to be a member of that Body or hold the post after the acceptance of his/her resignation.
- c) A member of the Board of Management of the University shall automatically cease to be member on his being convicted by a Court of law for any offence. Including moral turpitude.
- d) Vacancy of a member arising by reason of death, resignation, and removal or otherwise shall be filled as soon as feasible, and the member so nominated shall be a Member for the un-expired portion of the term.

Statute 11**FORMATION, POWERS, DUTIES AND ACTIONS OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL****FORMATION OF ACADEMIC COUNCIL:**

1. The Academic Council shall be the principal academic body of the University and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances and regulations, co-ordinate and exercise general supervision over its academic policies. The Academic Council shall consist of the following members:
 - a) Chairperson - Vice-Chancellor
 - b) Members - All Deans of Faculty and all Chairpersons of Board of Studies.
 - c) Nominated members - Two teachers above the cadre of Associate Professor / Reader from each constituent Institutions and to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor for a term of Two years. Teacher can be re-nominated for second term continuously. Teacher cannot be re-nominated for continuous third term; however he/she will become eligible for nomination again after break of one term.

- d) Controller of Examinations.
- e) Member Secretary-Registrar.
- f) One representative nominated by Chairman, Regulatory Commission.
- g) Three members from among the Principals/Deans/Directors of constituent Institutions to be nominated by Vice-Chancellor in rotation.
- h) External Members: Two members from other Universities to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.
2. Members who wish to resign the membership shall give in writing an application to the Registrar, who shall forward it with his/her remarks to the Vice-Chancellor for necessary action.
3. Member who remains absent for three consequent meetings without prior permission and valid reason, shall cease to be member of the Council. Casual vacancies shall be filled for the remainder period of the term of Member.
- Removal/Disqualification:
- (f) The person who resigns from his/her post in University ceases to be member:
- (i) On removal or dismissal from his/her post in University.
- (ii) Convicted for any offence including moral turpitude.
- (iv) Nominating Authority may remove a Member who is sick, insane and is capable of discharging duty in the Council.
- (v) Nominating Authority may remove a Member who is found guilty of misconduct, indiscipline and malpractice in the University, or outside.
4. CONDUCT:
- (a) The Vice-Chancellor, as the Chairperson, shall preside over the meetings of the Academic Council and in his/her absence, any other person nominated by the Chancellor shall preside over the meeting.
- (b) The Registrar shall be the Member-Secretary of the Academic Council and in the absence of the Registrar, any other person authorized by the Vice-Chancellor shall act as the Secretary.
- (c) One third of the members of the Academic Council including the Chairperson shall form the quorum at a meeting, provided that no quorum shall be necessary for adjourned meetings. Ordinarily fifteen days notice shall be given for all meetings of the Academic Council.
- (d) The term of the nominated members of the Academic Council will be three years. ST-25

5. GENERAL RULES OF THE MEETING OF ACADEMIC COUNCIL:

- (a) In general, the Academic Council shall meet twice a year (August & February). Vice Chancellor can requisite the meeting as and when required in addition to regular meetings.
- (b) Academic Council shall meet on requisition of Vice Chancellor.
- (c) Registrar shall notify the meeting on the orders of Vice Chancellor.
- (d) Registrar shall send the notification along with the agenda to the members by speed post or by email, 15 days before the date of meeting.
- (e) Approval of the resolutions shall be by simple majority of the Members present.
- (f) Vice Chancellor is authorized to invite experts as and when required. However such invitee members shall neither be counted to fulfill quorum requirement, nor have voting powers.
- (g) All the decisions of the Academic Council are subject to the final approval of Board of Management of the University.
- (h) Validity of Council meetings: Proceedings of the Council meetings shall not be invalidated
 - i. Due to vacancies in Academic Council.
 - ii. Due to non-receipt of meeting notice by any member or members.
 - iii. Due to defective nomination of any member.

6. POWERS, DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS:

- (a) The Academic Council shall be the Principal Academic Body of the University and shall subject to the provisions of the The Adhiniyam, Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations, exercise the control and general regulation for the maintenance of the standards of instructions, education and examinations of the University.
- (b) As the Authority of the University, shall be the principle body for laying down educational policy and shall subject to the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations see to the coordination and general superintendence of its implementation.
- (c) To co-opt as members persons having special knowledge or experience in the subject matter of any particular business which may come before the Council for consideration. The members so co-opted shall have all the rights of the members of the Council in regard to the transaction of the business in relation to which they may be co-opted.

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- (d) To promote research and innovation related activities in the University.
- (e) To make recommendations to the Governing Body on the proposals receive from different faculties of the University, for the conferment of degrees, honoar degrees or any such other distinction (like Diplomas or Certificates) or honour of the University.
- (f) Emphasis shall be given for overall development of students to excel in the life not only as a professional but also as a responsible citizen.
- (g) Frame the rules and regulations to control the indiscipline in general and malpractices, unacceptable methods in the examinations or amend with the approval of Board of Management.
- (h) Approve the launching/commencing of new courses of studies.
- (i) Frame the Calendar of Events for the academic year for the various courses.
- (j) Approve the rules of conduct/behaviors and etiquette of the students in the Institutions, the Hostels and in and outside campus.
- (k) Discuss and decide on the matters put up by the respective Boards of Studies.
- (l) To arrange and order annual inspections by the Local Committees of constituent Institutions to maintain high standards.
- (m) Prescribe the methodology, schemes, and modalities of Internal and University examinations including the internal ones.
- (n) Prescribe the detailed methodology, scheme and allotment of marks for individual subjects in all the courses.
- (o) Discuss and accord approval of schedules of examinations as proposed by the Controller of examinations.
- (p) Discuss and accord approval of methods of reporting malpractice cases, method of enquiry, and the punishments.
- (q) Discuss and decide on all the recommendations of various sub-committees appointed for the specific purposes.
- (r) Appoint various sub committees as and when required for specific purpose/task. The committees shall cease to function after completing the task assigned.
- (s) Constitute including formation of such committees as may be required to deal with special individual cases of indiscipline of employees, students. Indiscipline among the group, un-authorized absence, misbehaviour, misappropriation, and thefts will also be looked into by the Council.
- (t) To consider and act on the recommendations of such committees.
- (u) To take up the matters for periodical review of functioning and co-ordination between all the constituent Institutions and/departments and recommend to the Board of Management, the ways and means of improvement.
- (v) To initiate and promote research and related activities in various constituent institutions and centres.

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- (w) To consider other academic or student welfare matters referred to the Academic Council.
- (x) To recognize degrees/diplomas of other Universities/institutions and determine their equivalence.
- (y) To appoint committees for admission of students in different faculties of University.
- (z) To make special arrangements, if any, for the teaching of women students and for prescribing for them special courses of study.
- (aa) To recognize persons of eminence in their subjects to be associated as research guide, in the subject as prescribed in the Ordinance.
- (ab) Academic Council shall ensure that while framing rules, syllabus and curriculum norms of the Regulatory Body i.e. AICTE, MCI, DCI, Pharmacy Council, Indian Nursing Council & Bar Council etc. as laid down from time to time, are adhered to.

Statute 12

FINANCE COMMITTEE:

(v) **CONSTITUTION:**

There shall be a Finance Committee of the University consisting of the following members, namely:

- a. The Vice Chancellor – Chairperson
- b. One Member to be nominated by the Chancellor preferably with Chartered Accountant background.
- c. One member to be nominated by Governing Body.
- d. One Member to be nominated by board of Management from amongst its members.
- e. One Member to be nominated by the Academic Council from among its Members;
- f. The Registrar;
- g. Chief Finance & Accounts Officer, as Member Secretary;
- h. As per the provision of Act 2007 and as amended time to time.

(ii) **TENURE:**

The terms of office of nominated members, except the ex-officio members, shall be three years. Vacancies shall be filled up in the same manner as the original constitution. In absence of the ex officio Member, the person so assigned to discharge his/her duty shall be the Member and carry out the assigned duties.

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(iii) POWERS AND FUNCTIONS

The Finance Committee shall perform the following functions namely:

- (a) Shall vet the annual projections/estimates of income and expenditure including capital expenditure and their assumptions thereto of the university prepared by the board of management, it shall put up to the governing body for its consideration and approval, after incorporating its expert views.
- (b) Shall vet and analyze the annual financial statements and accounts of the university prepared by the Board of Management and its recommendation thereon along with the annual budget, it shall put it up to the Governing Body for its consideration and approval.
- (c) Shall make its recommendations to the Governing Body to accept bequests, and donations of property to the university on such terms as deemed proper.
- (d) Shall recommend mechanism and ways and means to generate and enlarge resources of the university.
- (e) To conduct a scrutiny of accounts of the university, whenever called upon by the board of Management.
- (f) To review the concurrent and the yearly audit reports and make recommendations thereupon;
- (g) To scrutinize all proposals involving expenditure for which no provision is made in the budget or involving expenditure in excess of the amount in the budget including creation, up-gradation or abolition of posts considered superfluous in the university;
- (h) To prepare policy and procedure guidelines for purchase/procurements at the institutions.
- (i) Notwithstanding anything contained in the above sections, the vice chancellor with the approval of chancellor may in case of urgency and for reasons to be recorded in writing incur, without the approval of the Finance Committee, any expenditure, in any one case for which no provision is made in the budget or which is in excess of the provisions made in the budget;

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Provided, that such expenditure shall be placed before the finance committee for ratification at its immediate next meeting.

Provided further that, if the incurring of expenditure by the Vice Chancellor is not satisfactory, the finance committee may refer it to the chairperson of the Governing Body, whose decision in the matter shall be final.

- (j) Shall consider any other matter referred to it by the Governing Body and make its recommendations thereon.
- (k) Shall advise the Governing Body on any question affecting the finances.
- (l) Shall be responsible for the observance of Regulations relating to the maintenance of accounts and accounting system of the University.
- (m) Where the votes on any subject considered by the Finance committee are equally divided, the Vice Chancellor shall have the casting vote.
- (n) It will go through Audited Financial Statements, analyze them and give a report to Board of Management and also scrutinize all irregularities and monitor their complete compliance/ rectifications.
- (o) It is empowered to appoint any specific audit including stock audit.

(iv) **MEETINGS & QUORUM:**

- (a) The Finance committee shall meet at least once in three months.
- (b) Four members of the Finance Committee shall form the quorum.

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Statute 17 ✓

BOARD OF STUDIES

There shall be Boards of Studies pertaining to the following subjects/group of subjects:

- (a) In Pre and Para Clinical subjects comprising of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry Pathology, Pharmacology, Microbiology, Forensic Medicine, and Community Medicine.
- (b) In Clinical subjects comprising of Medicine, Surgery, Otorhyno- laryngology Radiology, Anesthesiology, Pediatrics, Ophthalmology, Psychiatry, Dermatology Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Obstetrics and Gynecology.
- (c) In Dentistry
- (d) In Pharmacy
- (e) In Nursing
- (f) In Para medical & Vocational Courses
- (g) In Management and Hotel Management
- (h) In Engineering, Technology, Architecture & Computer Science
- (i) In Mass Media, Fine Arts, Performing Art & Design
- (j) In Arts, Social Sciences, Humanities & Languages
- (k) In Sciences, Life Sciences & Home Science
- (l) In Commerce.
- (m) In Education & Physical Education
- (n) In Ayush
- (o) In Agriculture

The Chancellor, on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor may include any subjects not covered in the above list to any of the Boards as above and may delete subjects, if required.

CONSTITUTION OF BOARD OF STUDIES:

- a) The Board of Studies shall be constituted by the Chancellor on the recommendations of Vice-Chancellor.
- b) The Members of the Board of Studies shall not exceed twenty exclusive of at least two external members in each Board. External means teachers working in other University.
- c) The chairman & Members of the Board of Studies will be nominated by the Chancellor among the teachers in the University.

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- d) The term of Chairman and Members is three years. Members can be re-nominated for a maximum of three consequent terms. The Chairman shall be nominated from among the senior teachers in BOS, on rotation.
- e) When the Chairman of the Board resigns or remains absent for any reason, one of the members of the Board will act as Chairman with the Vice-Chancellor's approval.
- f) The Chairman of Board of Studies shall have the right to co-opt whenever necessary experts or specialists in any particular subject to act as member of the said Board for the purpose of considering any particular subject with prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor. The Members co-opted shall not exceed two at any time. Co-opted Members shall offer their expert opinions whenever sought and shall not form a part of the Board proceedings.

COMPOSITION OF EACH BOARD:

- (a) One member from among the professors in each subject to be nominated by Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of Head of Institution.
- (b) Four teachers from among all the teachers in the specialty, other than professors and possessing PG qualification in any specialty, in the group of subjects to be nominated by Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of Head of Institution.
- (c) Two senior members of teaching faculty from Institutions other than Amaltas University shall be nominated as external members for a term of three years.
- (d) Members shall be responsible for ensuring that minimum recommendations about curriculum laid down by Regulatory Bodies, MCI, DCI, AICTE, Pharmacy Council, INC, Bar Council, etc are followed.

REMOVAL/DISQUALIFICATION OF MEMBER:

- (a) The member ceases to be so:
- (i) On resignation/removal from University
- (ii) When convicted for any offence including moral turpitude.
- (b) A member can be removed:
- (i) Who is sick, insane and incapable of discharging the duties in the board.
- (ii) Who is found guilty of misconduct, indiscipline and malpractice.

POWER AND FUNCTIONS OF BOARD OF STUDIES:

- (a) The Boards of Studies shall prepare and recommend the detailed courses of study and curriculum at the different levels of studies in the respective subjects.

- (b) Board of Studies may recommend to the Academic Council any matter connected with the academics/examinations in its subjects and address them on any matters relating to improvement in the courses of studies.
- (C) The Board of Studies shall be responsible:
- (i) To prepare syllabus for several courses of study under their preview.
 - (ii) To prepare scheme of examinations.
 - (iii) To prepare panels of names of persons suitable for appointment as paper-setters/examiners/valuers.
 - (iv) To advise the University authorities on such matters as may be referred to them by any authority of University.
 - (v) To consider and recommend to the Academic Council establishment of new courses, inter-disciplinary courses and short-term training programs referred to it.
 - (vi) To plan and organize inter-departmental and inter-faculty programs in consultation with the Board of Studies of other faculties.
 - (vii) To Prepare submit the Annual Report of the functioning of Department to the Vice-Chancellor.
 - (viii) To go through and consider any other academic matter which may be referred to it for opinion.

QUORUM:

One third of the members of the Board of Studies shall form a quorum for its meetings. This should include one external member of the Board of Studies. The meeting of the Board of Studies will be arranged at least once in a year.

JOINT MEETINGS:

Whenever it is deemed necessary the Vice-Chancellor shall be competent to convene Joint Meetings of two or more Boards of Studies and the Vice-Chancellor shall appoint the Chairman for any such meeting(s).

OPINION BY CIRCULATION:

The Vice-Chancellor may in urgent cases obtain the opinion of the Chairman of Board of Studies or of full Board of Studies by circulations of any proposal among them. Such opinion together with the action taken thereon shall be communicated to all the members. /

VALIDITY OF BOARD OF STUDIES MEETINGS:

Proceedings of the Board of Studies meetings shall not be invalidated merely due to

- (a) Due to vacancies in Board of Studies.
- (b) Due to non receipt of meeting notice by any member or members.
- (c) due to defective nomination of any member

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- during the two preceding years. The Committee may add to the list the names and experience of persons qualified for appointment as examiners but not included therein.
5. The Registrar's/Controller of examination's office shall also give the Examination Committee the approximate number of candidates expected to appear at each examination and the list of centers of each practical/Viva-voce examination together with the estimated number of Candidates thereat.
 6. The Examination Committee shall, in the light of the provisions of the following paragraph, Recommend :
 - (i) A panel of three names for the appointment of the paper setter of each written paper.
 - (ii) A list of names of persons for appointment as co-examiners where necessary, the number of names included in the list being at least 50% percent in excess of the number to the appointment.
 - (iii) A list of names of persons for appointment as examiners in each practical/Viva voce examination, the number of names included in the list being sufficient for the conduct of practical/Viva-voce examination at different center.
 7. The Vice-Chancellor shall appoint paper setters, co-examiners, practical/Viva-voce examiners ordinarily from amongst persons recommended by the Examination Committee. He may, however, appoint a person whose name is not included in the list of names recommended by the Examination Committee if he is satisfied that the person in question possesses the minimum qualification and his appointment will not be contrary to the provisions of the following paragraph.
 8. The qualifications of the paper setters and Co-examiners shall be as follows: The Qualification & Experience of the paper setter & CO-Examiners shall be as per the norms laid down by the related regulatory bodies viz, UGC, MCI, DCI, BCI, NCI, PCI etc.
 9.
 - (1) in case of practical and Viva-voce examinations at the post graduate level, the external examiner shall be a person not below the rank of the Reader or equivalent
 - (2) In case of Practical and Viva-voce examinations at the first degree level the external examiner shall be teacher of the subject with not less than three years experience of teaching the subject at the degree and/or postgraduate level.
 - (3) The internal examiner in case of Viva-voce examination at the postgraduate level shall be the Head of Department in the subject whose regular candidates are to be examined.

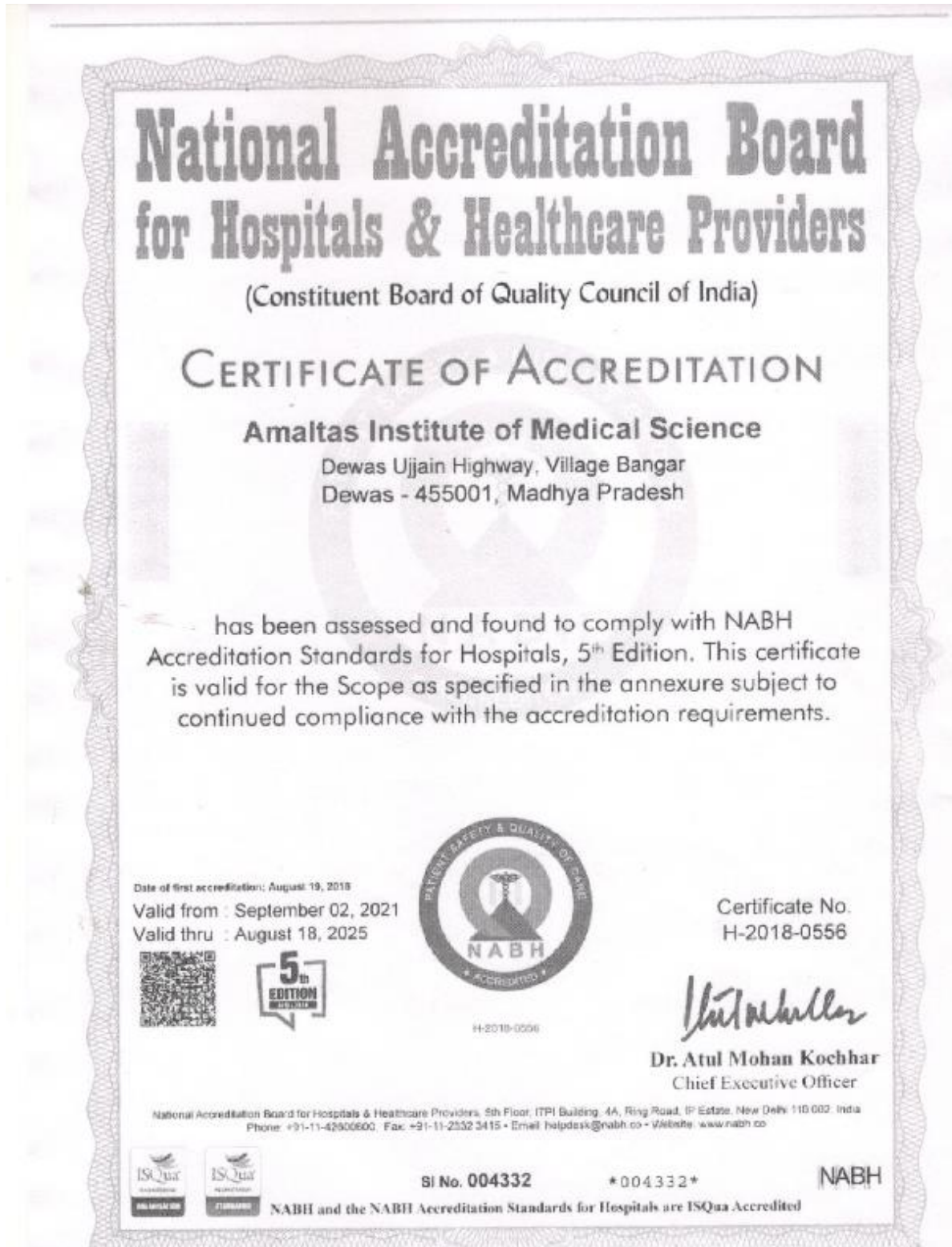



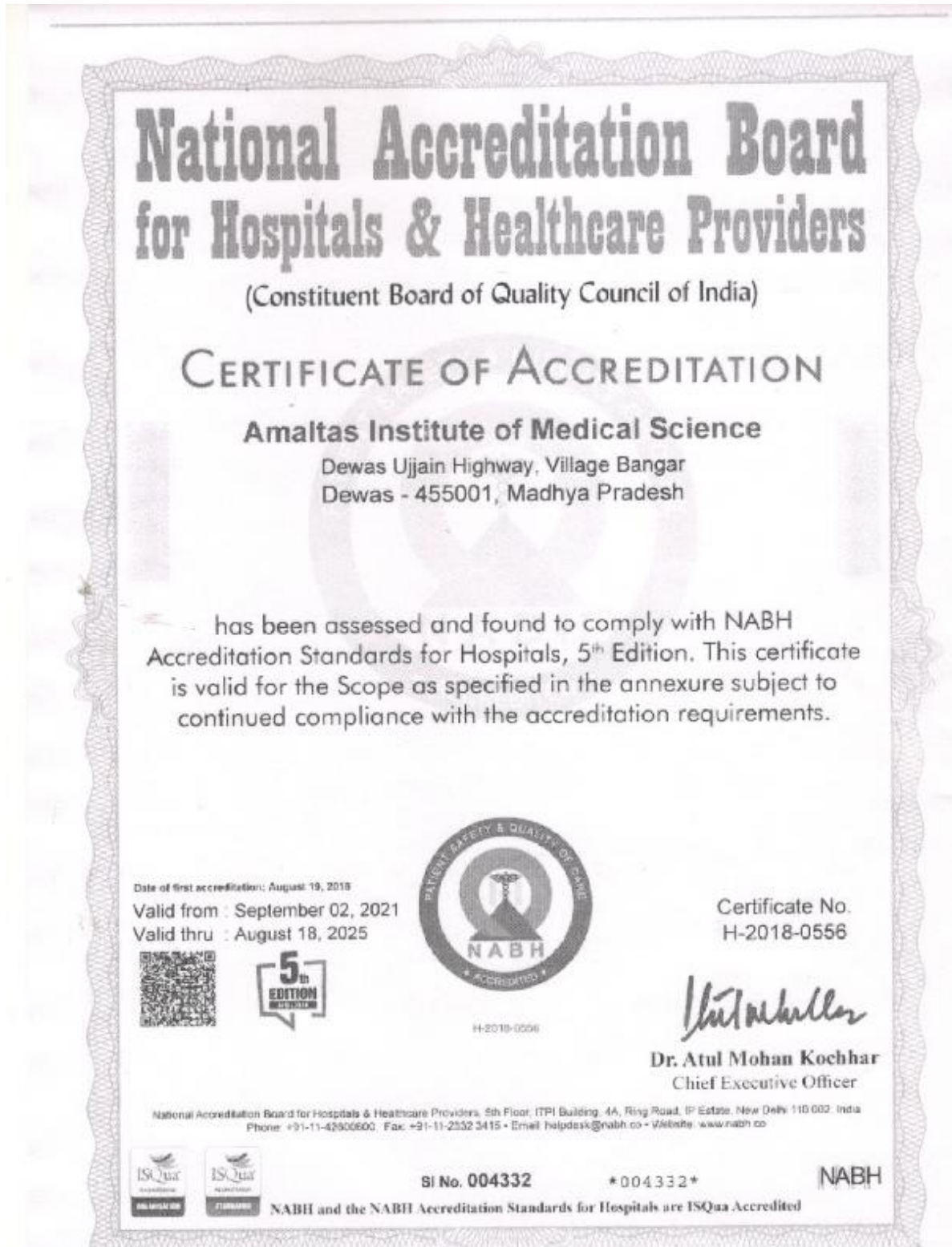

This Agreement is made at Bhopal on this 24th day of May, 2020

BETWEEN

Directorate of Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare, (hereinafter referred to as the "Directorate of Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare" or "DHS" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, include its administrators, successors and assignees) of the **FIRST PART**, represented by Director, Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare, Madhya Pradesh;

AND

Amaltas Institute of Medical Sciences, Dewas


(hereinafter referred to as the "Service Provider" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to include its affiliates, successors, permitted assignees and substitutes) of the **SECOND PART** represented by Medical Superintendent, Dr. B.H. Nandhari, Amaltas Institute of Medical Sciences, village Bangar, District Dewas (M.P.)

Each party namely, Directorate of Health Services and Service Provider individually shall be termed as "Party" and in combination shall be termed as "Parties".

Whereas

- A. COVID-19 has taken the dimensions of pandemic in recent months and has affected most of the states including Madhya Pradesh. Hence, there is an urgent need to strengthen the existing healthcare infrastructure in the state to address the medical care requirement for confirmed or suspected COVID 19 patients.
- B. Global experience suggests that COVID-19 patients need to be put under observation and treatment in a separate hospital, instead of a general hospital, to minimize the chance of transmission to others.
- C. Government of Madhya Pradesh intends to bring in private sector efficiency in fighting against COVID-19. Govt of India has prescribed guidelines about various aspects of fight against COVID and for complying with these guidelines, COVID dedicated hospitals have to be set up. That looking at the limitations of public healthcare infrastructure, it is necessary that private hospitals be considered for making them dedicated facilities to treat COVID patients.
- D. In view of the above, Government of Madhya Pradesh is taking the initiative of engaging with private health establishments to be called the "COVID-19 Hospital" as Service Provider by utilizing their full or partial infrastructure to provide services and treatment to confirmed or suspected COVID-19 patients at their premises. In case of partial utilization of Service Provider's infrastructure and resources, Service Provider may carry on its normal course of business of treating non COVID patients subject to complying with extant norms and guidelines issued by MoHFW, ICMR and State Government.
- E. For the said purposes Amaltas Institute of Medical Sciences, Dewas has desired to partner with Government of Madhya Pradesh to be a Service Provider and act as a COVID-19 Hospital.
- F. Service Provider represents as follows:-
 1. It is a registered entity under extant laws of India and is duly authorized by its Board of Directors/ Board of Governors to carry out the obligations as specified under the Scope of Work.
 2. It has necessary infrastructure, including labs, diagnostic facilities, human resources, physical infrastructure, such as ICU, Beds, Doctors, nurses, requisite support staff, etc. to carry out the obligations as specified under the Scope of Work.
- G. Service Provider understands and agrees that Government of Madhya Pradesh may deploy the services and the infrastructure of the Service Provider for the purposes of emergency of COVID-19.

H. Based on the representations made by the Service Provider, Government of Madhya Pradesh through Directorate of Health Services agrees to engage with Amaltas Institute of Medical Sciences, Dewas as a Service Provider and to be designated as a COVID-19 hospital.

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the foregoing and the respective covenants and agreements set forth in this Agreement, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally binding hereby, both the Parties agree as follows:

NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AND THIS DEED WITNESSETH AS UNDER:

1 DEFINITIONS

"Agreement" shall mean this agreement;

"COVID-19 Hospital" shall have the meaning as specified under Recital D above;

"DHS" shall mean Directorate of Health Services, Government of Madhya Pradesh;

"Designate-Official" shall mean to include any official designated by Directorate Health Services, Madhya Pradesh to carry out various activities provided under this Agreement, as set forth under Clause 3(ii) of this Agreement.

"Patient" shall mean to include any confirmed or suspected COVID patient.

"Service Payment" shall have the meaning as set forth under Clause 6 of this Agreement;

2 SCOPE OF WORK OF SERVICE PROVIDER

The Service Provider shall at all times maintain requisite materials, infrastructure and human resources as specified in Clause 2.4 in such quantity which caters to the dynamic need of COVID-19 cases.

2.1 In no case Service Provider shall deny any patient or refer the patient to any other facility for lack of any materials or resources, unless informed and directed by Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare. Service Provider shall at all times maintain prescribed quality, generally accepted in normal course, of deliverables, consumables and products for treatment of COVID-19 cases.

2.2 Service Provider shall ensure compliance to the prescribed guidelines and protocols for treatment of COVID-19 cases issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, World Health Organization, Indian Council of Medical Research, and Government of Madhya Pradesh from time to time. The Service Provider shall ensure to update and implement any updated protocols in line with the updates from any aforesaid authorities.


2.3 The Service Provider shall ensure mandatory compliance to the following requirements, materials, services at all times.

i. Provide OPD services for screening and management of referred cases including emergency/critical care. Service Provider understands that Department reserves the right to partially or fully utilize the available infrastructure of Service Provider as detailed in sub clause ii of this Clause. Accordingly, Service Provider may in compliance to relevant guidelines and notifications issued by MoHFW, ICMR or State Government continue to utilize non offered infrastructure for treatment of non COVID 19 patients.

Service Provider shall maintain separate treating staff, supporting staff, beds, floors, entries and exits, OPD waiting areas for non COVID patients and suspected or confirmed COVID patients. Notwithstanding anything contained herein, no payments shall be made to Service Provider for treatment of non COVID patients by the Department.

ii. Make available following number of beds to providing medical care to COVID-19 patients; (Offered Infrastructure)-

- iii. Admit patients and provide treatment of only COVID-19 cases including confirmed or suspected as per the prevalent protocol which may alter time to time. This shall include treatment of comorbidities.
- iv. Provide critical care due to COVID-19 or other treatment arising out of complications of COVID-19 to all patients.
- v. Procure and provide required drugs and consumables for treatment of COVID-19 patients.
- vi. Procure and provide necessary safety equipment to staff dealing with COVID-19 patients.
- vii. Adhere to all safety guidelines issued by Government of Madhya Pradesh and Government of India from time to time.
- viii. Implement infection control mechanism (including bio-medical waste disposal).
- ix. Provide and designate requisite numbers of ambulance and mortuary services and dead body disposal mechanism.
- x. Make available adequate technical manpower including specialists as required and not less than as declared under during registration under Nursing and Clinical Establishment Act, 1973.
- xi. Provide laboratory and radiology services to COVID-19 patients.
- xii. The patients should be provided a copy of Discharge summary at the time of discharge without fail.
- xiii. Provide utility services, like housekeeping, laundry, diet and security services.
- xiv. Nominate a senior nodal officer for single point co-ordination with Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare.
- xv. Provide any other facilities and services based on the emerging needs to deal with COVID-19 situation.
- xvi. Maintain sanitation, cleanliness and hygiene, minimize potential spread of infection as per good industry practices.
- xvii. Provide access to Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare or its authorized CMHOs or any Dean, Medical College or any other officials designated by Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare or District Collector or any officials designated by District Collector to conduct inspection, as and when required, and to provide necessary support during inspection.
- xviii. Adhere to the operational specifications and performance standards as provided under Schedule I of this Agreement.
- xix. Adhere to the reporting obligations as per the provisions under Clause 5 of this Agreement.
- xx. Service provider hospital shall not deny treatment to any Covid-19 patient, suspected or confirmed referred by designate official.
- xxi. In such cases, where any covid-19 patient reaches the hospital directly, he will be admitted under information to designated official.

3 OBLIGATIONS OF Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare

Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare shall

- i. Make payment to the Service Provider on a timely basis for providing services under this Agreement as per the provisions under Clause 6 and Clause 7 of this Agreement
- ii. Nominate an official under Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare / Director, Medical Education to be the "Designate Official" for overseeing and monitoring service delivery by the Service Provider. The Designate Official shall also refer patients for availing services in the COVID-19 Hospital.

- iii. Nominate an alternate official under Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare / Director, Medical Education to function as the Designate Official and fulfill all responsibilities vested in the Designate Official.
- iv. Reserve the right to do periodic inspection of the COVID-19 Hospital for monitoring the service delivery and direct the Service Provider to remedy any defect or deficiency observed during such inspection
- v. Facilitate arranging insurance cover for the employees of Service Provider of all Hospital and other Administrative staff etc. engaged in the COVID-19 Hospital @ Rs. 50 lakh per person in accordance with the extant guidelines issued by Government of India or Govt. of Madhya Pradesh.
- vi. DHS shall endeavor to assist the Service Provider in procurement of essential material for treatment of COVID-19 patients.

4 ELIGIBLE PATIENTS FOR TREATMENT

Only patients referred by Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare or Designate Official or any other authority, as directed by Government of Madhya Pradesh, will be provided services in the COVID-19 Hospital. However, any Covid-19 symptomatic patient will be admitted by the hospital under intimation to Designate official.

5 REPORTING BY SERVICE PROVIDER

The Service Provider shall submit following reports to Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare:

- i. Daily report to Designate Official of Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare on details of patients registered and being treated (suspected, under treatment, cured and in ICU). The details of patients shall include name, age, gender, date of registration, conditions of the patient and any other details as required.
- ii. Treatment notes and records for all cases shall be maintained, till ordered by Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare.
- iii. Service Provider shall ensure assisting designated officials in Death Audit or LAMA/DAMA cases and furnishing requisite reports to appropriate authorities from time to time.
- iv. Monthly report on adherence to the operational specifications & performance standards as defined under Schedule I of this Agreement.
- v. Any other report as prescribed by Director/ Commissioner of health

The format and mode of reporting shall be mutually decided and agreed by the Parties prior to the reporting. Service Provider understands and assures that all data, reports, information received from Directorate of Health Services or any of its officials and patients information shall be treated confidential and any abuse of such information shall be treated per generally accepted confidentiality norms. Any violation of confidentiality norms shall be penalized under the extant laws.

6 SERVICE PAYMENT

6.1 Director, Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare shall make the payment to Service Provider for carrying out obligations under this Agreement. The payment to the Service Provider shall comprise of the following payable on a monthly basis as detailed below (the "Service Payment"):

- i. Service Provider shall be paid a Service Payment consisting of two parts:
 - a. fixed charge of INR 1,38,79,350/- per month; and
 - b. variable charge based on the daily bed occupancy at the rate INR 1,028/- per bed per day.

ii. This service payment is for in-patient beds and all human resources, services, consumables, deliverables, drugs, tests, diagnostics and infrastructure detailed in the Scope of work. The Service Payment shall comprise of all expenses pertaining to providing services under this Agreement, excluding COVID-19 test for which this is intended.

- iii. In addition to the Service Payment at sub clause (i), Service Provider shall be paid for the treatment of additional illness, if required, as per the applicable package rates under Ayushman Bharat – PMJAY.
- 6.2 Parties hereby agree that the Service Payment shall be reviewed periodically in the context of requirement as per emerging situation of COVID-19 and any change shall be mutually agreed between the Parties.
- 6.3 It is explicitly agreed and clarified that no charges will be payable by the patients themselves, and all charges for treatment of OPD/admitted patients will be deemed to have been included in para 6.1 above.
- 6.4 Health Commissioner, after giving an opportunity of hearing, may impose a penalty not exceeding 25 percent of daily fixed charge per day, if the quality of service provided by the Service provider is found to be deficient. Repeated imposition of penalty for service related defaults will be sufficient condition for termination of this agreement.

7 PAYMENT MECHANISM

- 7.1 The Service Provider shall raise invoice towards fixed Service Payment, under sub-clause (i) of clause 6.1 above, on a monthly basis at the end of every month during the Contract Period. The invoice shall be submitted to Directorate of Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare. Directorate Health Services, shall process the invoice and make the payment within seven days from the date of submitting the invoice by Service Provider.
- 7.2 Payment of variable charges will be based on the entry of required details of the COVID19 patients (PMJAY- Niramayam and Non- PMJAY Niramayam beneficiaries) in the TMS Lite software and the turnaround time of payment shall be as per the existing PMJAY standard operating protocol.
- 7.3 Any dispute between the Parties regarding the payment shall be resolved through dispute resolution mechanism provided under Clause 8.1 of this Agreement.

8 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

8.1 Dispute Resolution

- i. In case of any dispute arising between the Parties to this Agreement concerning its construction or application, or the rights, duties or obligations of any Party, such dispute shall be resolved through mutual consultation in amicable way.
- ii. In case any dispute is not resolved through sub-clause 8.1 (i) above, the party may approach for redressal of the same to the Secretary of Madhya Pradesh, Department of Health and Family Welfare.
- iii. In case of failure of redressal mechanism aforementioned, the parties may apply for arbitration under Madhya Pradesh Madhyasthian Adhikaran Adhiniyam, 1983.

8.2 Amendment & Waiver

All modifications and amendment to this agreement must be formally agreed to by the parties in writing. Modifications can occur only through direct amendment.

8.3 Validity & Termination

- i. This Agreement shall be valid for a period of three months from the date of execution and may be extended on terms mutually agreed between the parties unless terminated as prescribed in this Agreement.
- ii. This Agreement may be terminated by Directorate of Health Services or Service Provider with a 15-day prior notice to either party before expiry of the term.
- iii. This Agreement may be terminated by DHS for default as specified hereunder.

- a) The COVID-19 Hospital has failed to comply with the mandate and directions or protocols of Government of Madhya Pradesh, MoHFW, etc.
- b) The COVID-19 Hospital has failed to comply to the obligations under Scope of work and has materially impacted the performance under this Agreement, such as failure to maintain the prescribed manpower, facilities, supplies or infrastructure.
- c) The COVID-19 Hospital has failed to assist Designate Official of DHS in performance of this Agreement including non-furnishing of the reports, MIS, etc.
- d) The COVID-19 Hospital has denied beneficiaries or failed to maintain requisite quality standards in terms of MoHFW or DHS guidelines.
- e) The COVID-19 Hospital is found to be indulging in any untoward, unfair or illegal practices in violation of this Agreement or directives of MoHFW or DHS.

Provided the Directorate of Health Services shall issue show cause notice to the Service Provider and give them an opportunity to be heard, before taking any decision in the matter.

- iv. Upon termination or expiry of this Agreement, Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare shall be liable to pay any payment due or outstanding to the Service Provider for the period prior to the date of termination during which services are already provided by the Service Provider as per the provisions of this Agreement. The payments shall be in accordance with Clauses 6 and 7 of this Agreement. Service Provider shall be entitled to receive full payments for the aforesaid notice period in case of termination for no fault of Service Provider. In case of default by the Service Provider, decision regarding payment would be made, taking into account the nature of default and the services, if any, provided during the period of default.

8.4 Force Majeure

If the performance in whole or in part or any obligations under this agreement is prevented or delayed by any reason of Force Majeure, i.e., any extraordinary circumstances beyond human control, such as natural calamities, wars, riots, strike/ mass leave of employees, etc. for a period exceeding 15 days, Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare shall have the right to terminate the agreement. Upon termination of this Agreement on account of Force Majeure, Directorate Health Services, Department of Health and Family Welfare shall pay any payment due or outstanding to the Service Provider for the period prior to the date of termination during which services are already provided by the Service Provider as per the provisions of this Agreement

8.5 Indemnity

Each Party agrees and undertakes to keep other Parties indemnified, free and harmless from and against any / all demands, claims, damages, loss and all costs, charges and expenses whatsoever, including but not limited to the any contractual or statutory dues payable by the Party to its staff, employees, agents or government authorities in relation to the performance of obligations under this Agreement.

8.6 Notices
