Theme:

Cognitive, Clinical And Psycho- Neurological Aspects Of Addiction

Sub themes:

- 1. Stages of Addiction and Brain Changes: Binge, Withdrawal/Negative affect stage, Preoccupation (craving) stage
- 2. Stress and Addiction :HPA axis dysregulation, Stress-induced relapse mechanisms.
- 3. Adolescence and Neuro developmental Risk: risk-taking behaviour, Early exposure and long-term changes
- 4. Gender Differences in Neurobiology of Addiction: Hormonal influences on reward circuits, Different relapse vulnerabilities
- 5. Substance- and Behaviour-Specific Neurobiology: Alcohol, nicotine, cannabis, and opioid addiction, Stimulants: cocaine, amphetamines, methamphetamine, Behavioural addictions: gaming, gambling, internet use, Comparative neurobiology of substance vs. behavioural addictions
- 6. Clinical Neuroscience and Comorbidities: Cognitive and emotional dysregulation in addiction, Neurobiology of craving, relapse, and withdrawal, Dual diagnosis: psychiatric comorbidities and shared mechanisms Gut-brain axis and neuroimmune changes in addiction
- 7.Behavioural & Non-Substance Addictions, Gambling disorder: parallels with substance addiction, Gaming and internet addiction: emerging neurobiological models. Food and obesity: overlap between feeding circuits and addiction circuits.
- 8. Developmental & Environmental Factors: Adolescent brain vulnerability: immature prefrontal cortex, Early life stress and trauma: epigenetic programming, Environmental cues and conditioned learning (cue-reactivity, craving).
